Why Are Your Out-of-Pocket Drug Costs Changing?

If you are enrolled in **Medicare Part D**, you may have noticed that your out-of-pocket costs for the same drug from the same pharmacy may change from month-to-month.<sup>1</sup>

## Your exact costs will depend on the Medicare Part D plan you choose:



It is important to carefully compare plans in your area when selecting coverage because the medications covered may change each year



Premiums, deductibles, covered medications, and co-pay amounts **vary between plans** 

### Medicare's Extra Help Program



**For lower-income Medicare beneficiaries**, there is a support program called **Extra Help**, which can help you pay for your medicine and avoid the coverage gap.<sup>1,2</sup>

Each of these phases may come with different out-of-pocket costs, which dictates what you pay when you pick up your drug from the pharmacy.<sup>1</sup>

- For example, you **may or may not have an initial deductible**, which will not be more than \$505
- In the next phase, you may have **cost-sharing responsibilities** based on the plan you select
- Next, you may encounter the coverage gap. In this phase, you may be responsible for 25% of your drug's cost
- In the final phase, you will be **responsible for at most 5% of your drug's cost**



Even if you don't qualify for full Extra Help, **you may qualify for partial Extra Help** based on your income and assets. Just like full Extra Help, partial Extra Help can help you pay for your medicine.<sup>1,2</sup>

Extra Help may be available according to your income and assets<sup>3</sup>

In 2023, the Inflation Reduction Act will protect Medicare patients by phasing in a cap for outof-pocket costs and establishing a \$35 cap for a month's supply of insulin.<sup>4</sup>
